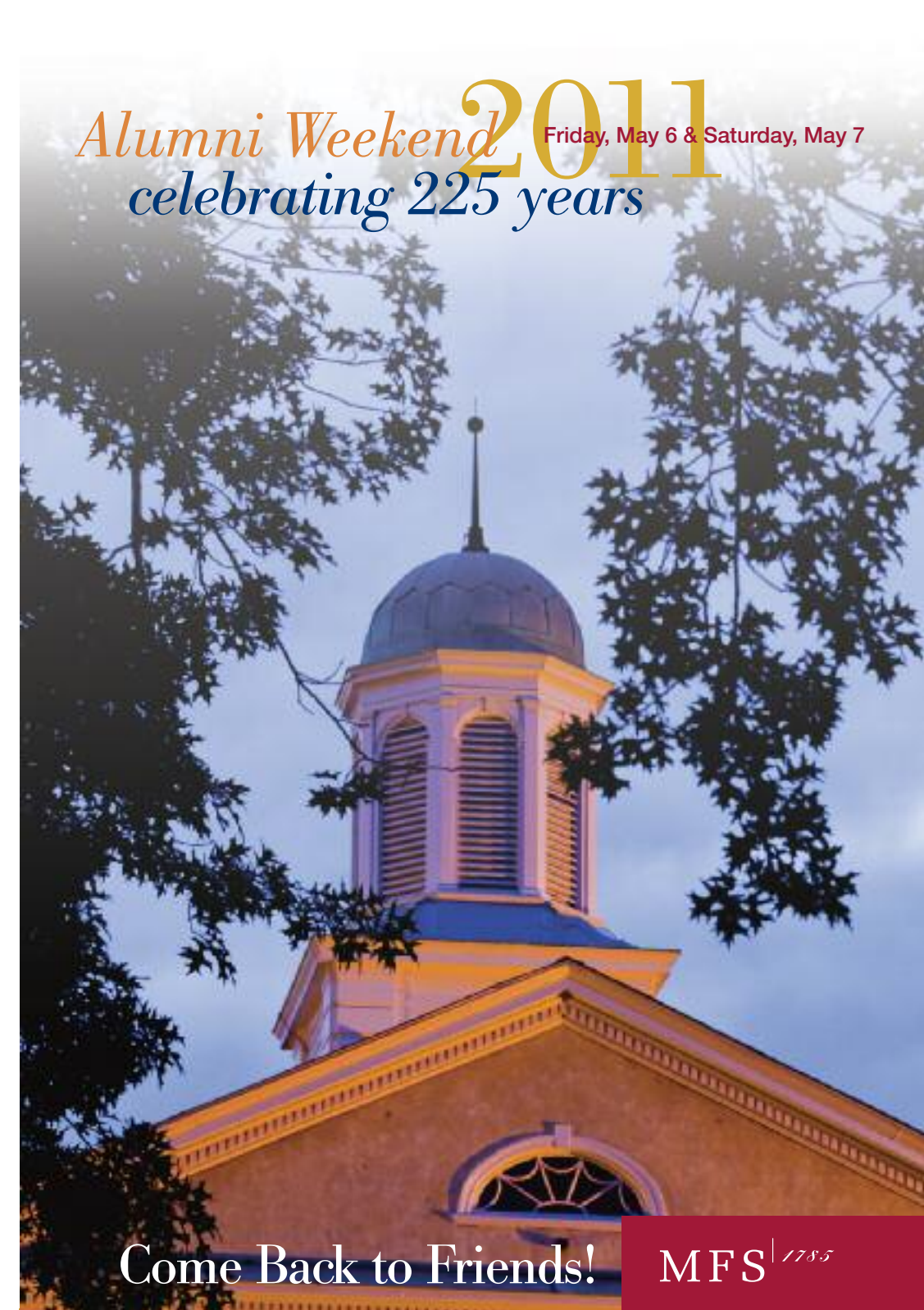
Class of 1986 Will have dinner at the Tortilla Press Cantina in Pennsauken at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday evening.

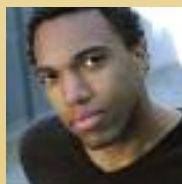

Judy Greenfield Faulkner, Class of 1961, will be awarded the Alice Stokes Paul 1901 Merit Award in honor of her vision, outstanding success

and commitment to social responsibility as a business leader in the field of health information technology. She is a founder, president and chief executive officer of Epic Systems, which was started in 1979 in Madison, Wisconsin. Epic is an independent employee-owned company with the motto, “Do good. Have fun. Make money.” It has the goal of eventually obtaining 80-90% of its energy needs from green sources including solar, biomass and wind power.



Jordan Barbour, Class of 2001, is the Young Alumni Award winner for his stellar accomplishments as an actor, singer and dancer. From his early

success in Columbia University’s Varsity Shows, while he was earning his joint degrees from Columbia and Julliard, to his appearances during the past year which have taken him across the globe, from the Sydney Opera House to the Contemporary Drama Festival in Budapest, Jordan is blazing an exciting artistic career.



Warren Sawyer, Alumni Parent and Former Trustee, will be presented with the Alumni Association’s Service award, in recognition of his decades

of devotion to Quaker values, as well as his dedication to MFS. Warren’s lifelong voluntarism is a wonderful example of faith in action, from his joining with the NAACP to integrate lunch counters in Kentucky, his courageous exposure of the systematic abuse of institutionalized mental patients in Pennsylvania, to his co-founding the fair housing group MEND here in Moorestown. His current volunteer roles include serving on the board of the John Woolman Center, giving tours at the Arch Street Meeting House in Philadelphia, reading stories to and transcribing them into Braille for a service group for the blind, and serving on four committees at Medford Leas.
